




Damien's Progression

Style: Chord Musical Concept: Harmonic Minor Chords








Damien came up with another great progression! This time we have a bit of an exotic flare by taking chords from the A Harmonic Minor Scale! Very cool.


Rose's Arpeggio

Joe's Hendrix Style 2


Style: Hendrix Musical Concept: Triads

Musical Concept: Drop D Power Chords



Dakota has been experimenting with some alternate tunings, and like every guitarist, first decided to try his hand at Drop D. Check out this cool riff that he came up with! This one also has a cool Phyrgian sound! Make sure to tune your low string down to D though!
